Qualifying for the Certificate

General Admissions Requirements:

- Applicants must be bilingual in English and either Spanish, or Mandarin Chinese, possessing college-level verbal and written knowledge of each language.
- A bachelor's degree is preferred. Applicants without a college degree must demonstrate the ability to perform university-level work, or have equivalent professional experience.

To apply to the Interpretation and Translation Certificate:

- Attend the information session (typically available in the Spring)
- Pay the application fee online towards your chosen program
- Pass the entrance assessment
